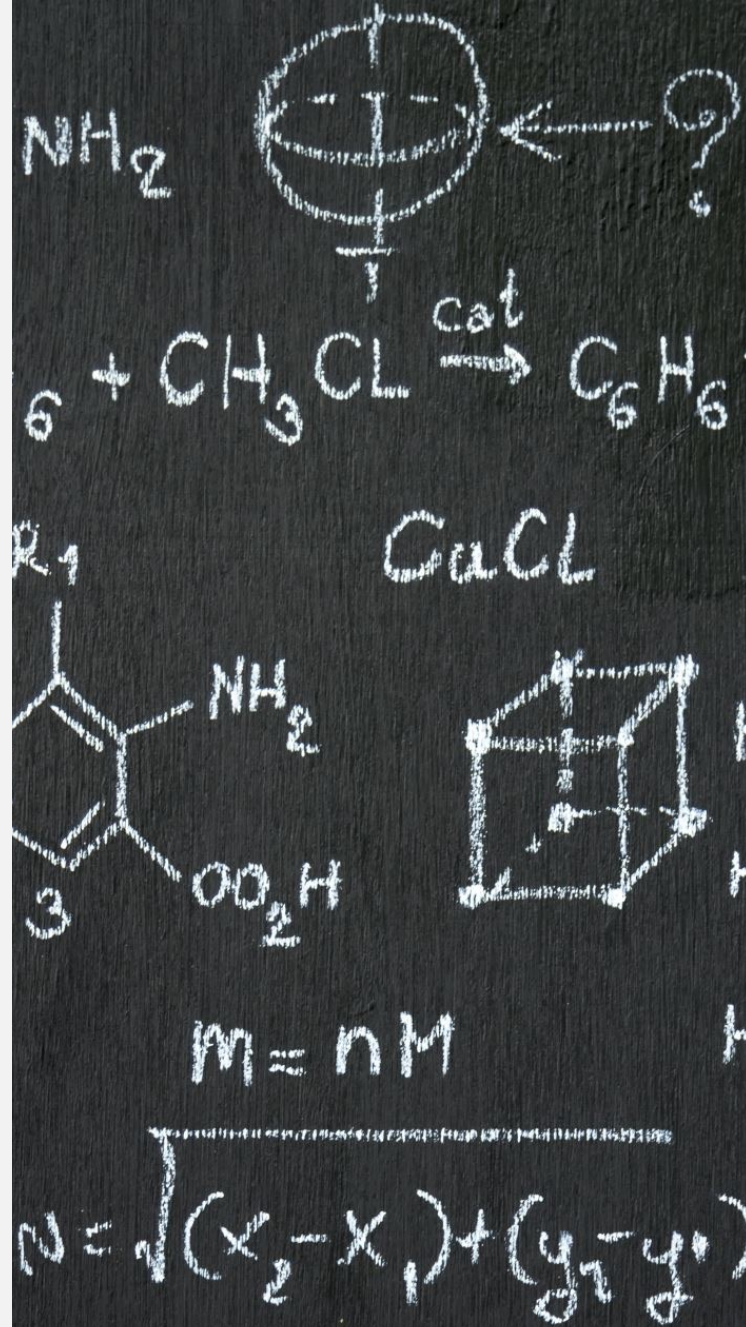

INCOMPLETES (ACADEMIC COURSE RESULTS)

INCOMPLETE (35% TO 49%)

- Register for Summer School (Academic Completion) to complete the course
- 4 weeks in July
- 1 ½ hours per day per course
- Can take 1 or 2 courses

The incomplete grade is changed in August to a PASS or FAIL



FAILS

FAILS (0% to 34%)

All compulsory courses must be repeated if failed
(English, Socials, Math, Science, PE)

Example: If you fail Math II, take Math II in first semester of grade 12 and then take Math II in second semester.

- 6 weeks in July & August
