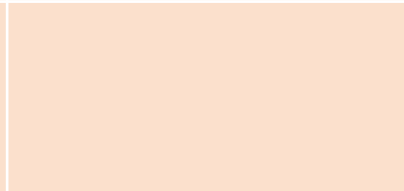

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

 - Totaling 20 courses
- 80 credits includes required courses and elective courses (a minimum of 4 courses (16 credits) at the Grade 12 level including English 12)
- Three Provincial Graduation Assessments:
 - Grade 10 Numeracy Assessment (GNA 10)
 - Grade 10 Literacy Assessment (GLA 10)
 - Grade 12 Literary Assessment (GLA 12)
- New Indigenous Education Requirement – all students will be required to complete this new requirement beginning next year.

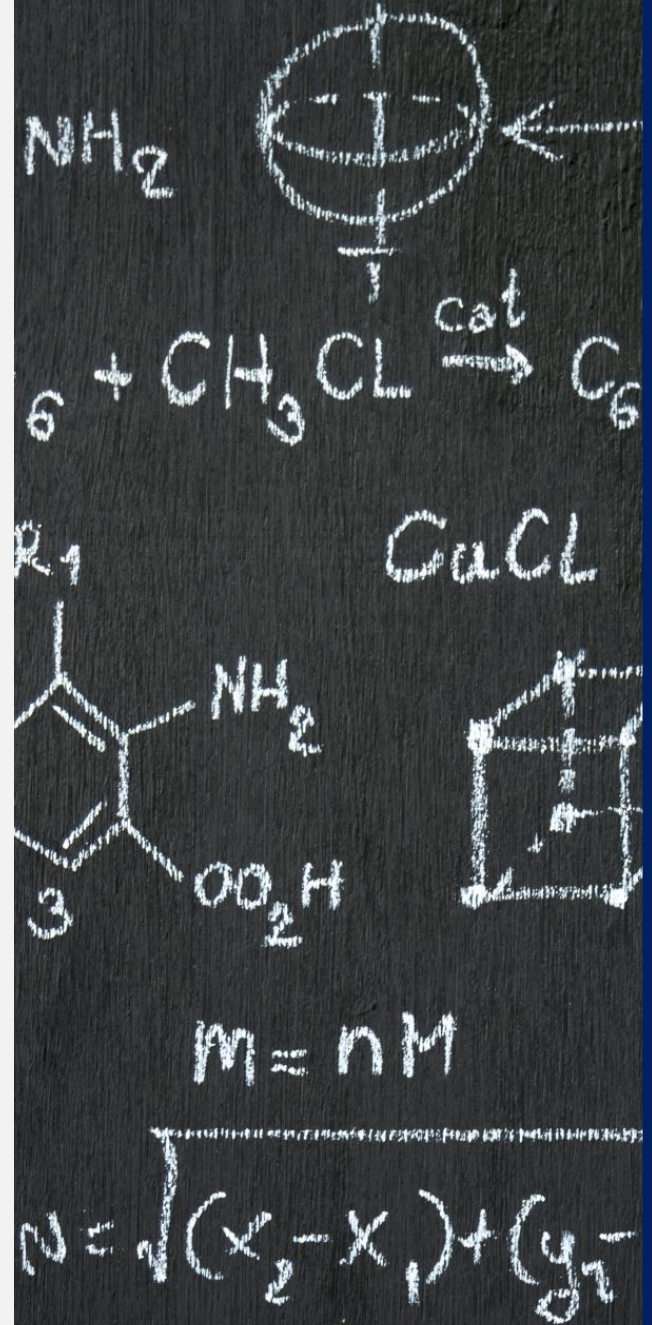

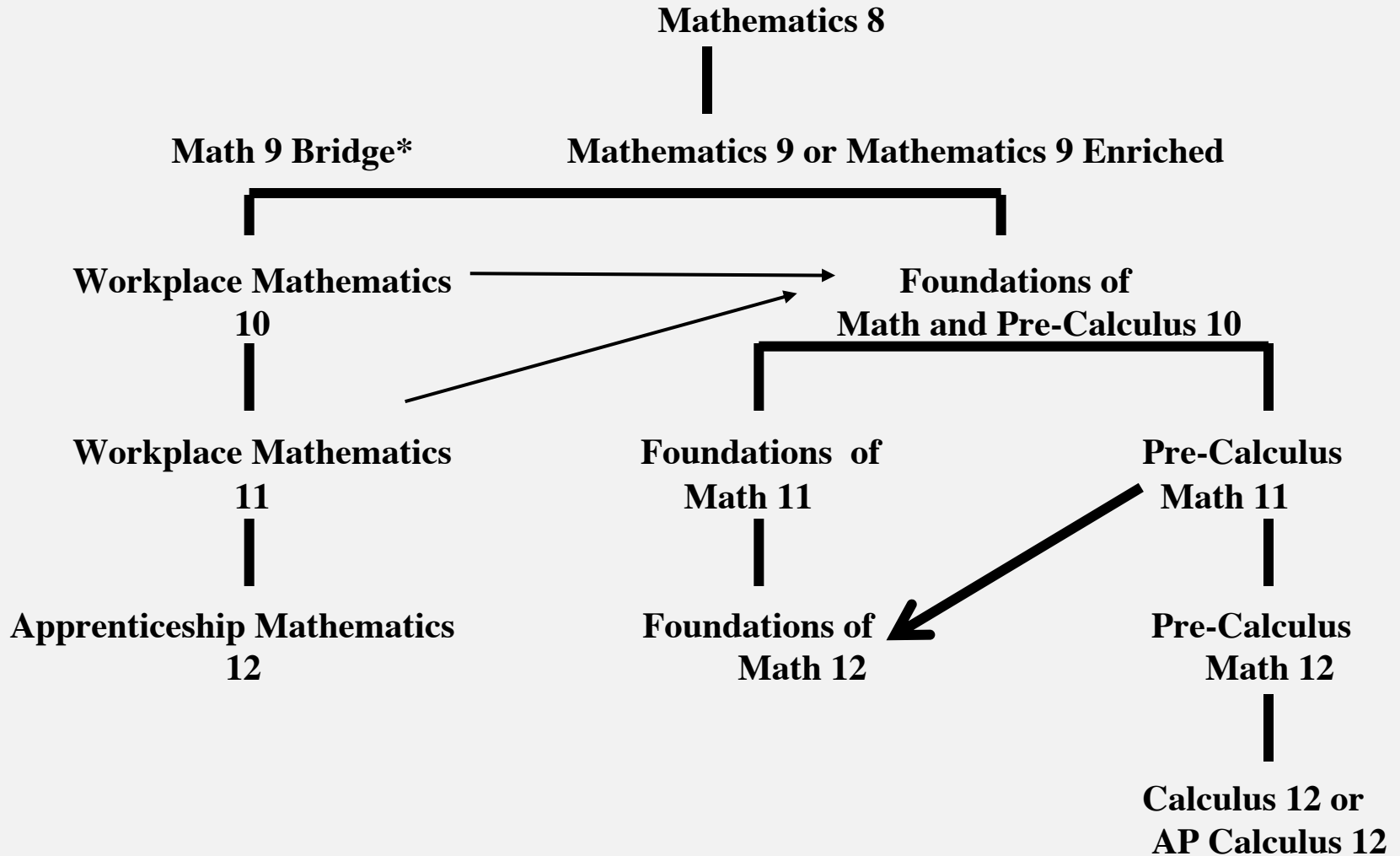

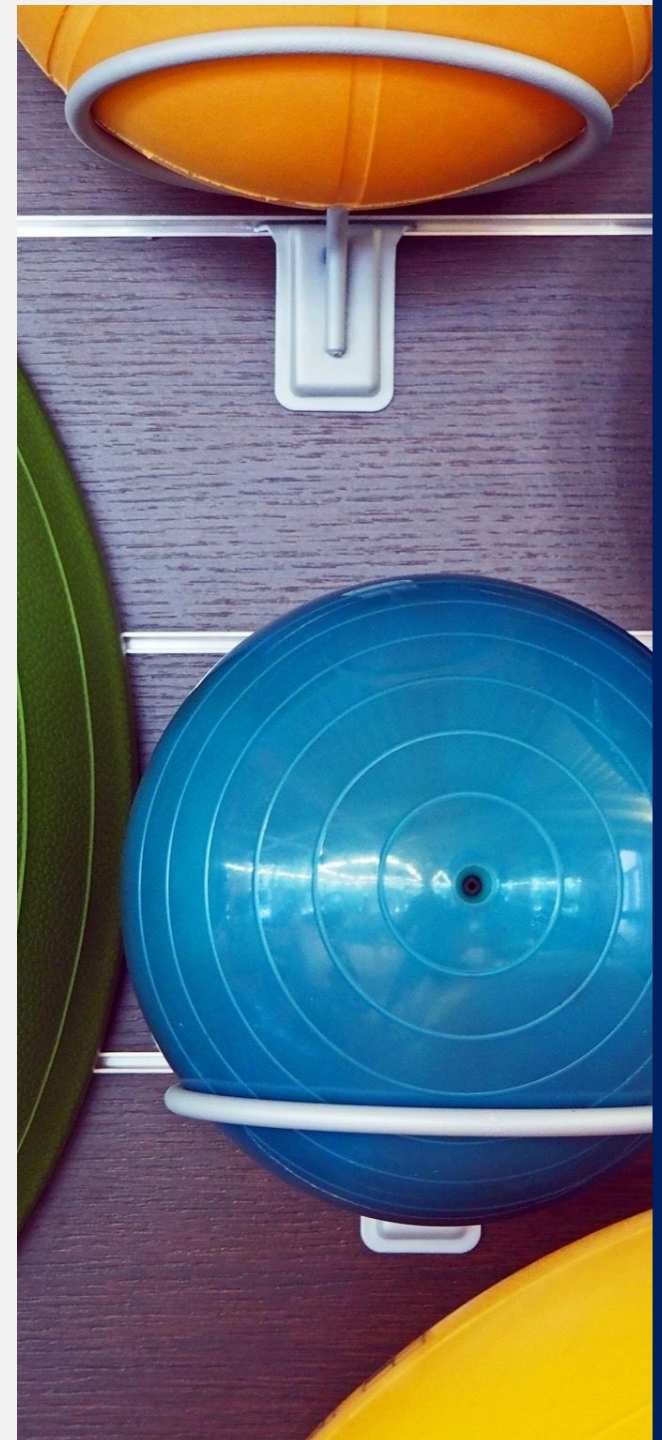
MATHEMATICS FLOW CHART

- **Attend Summer School (Academic Completion) to complete the course – register in May or earlier**
 - 4 weeks in July
 - 1 ½ hours per day per course
 - Can take 1 or 2 courses
 - The incomplete grade is changed in August to

a PASS or FAIL

FAILING grade

WHAT IS A FAILING SCORE?

- [0% TO 34%]

Example: If you fail Math 9, take Math 9 in first semester of grade 10 and then take Math 10 in second semester.

All compulsory courses must be repeated if failed (English, Socials, Math, Science, PE)

- The Youth Train in Trades programs offer hands-on skills acquisition through post-secondary technical training to students in Gr. 11/12 (apply in grades 10/11). **The first level of tuition is FREE (savings of ~\$2500-4000)** - paid for by the Richmond School Board.
- The Youth Work in Trades program means students aged 15-19 "earn while they learn", acquiring high school credits and industry credentialing in recognized trade, while in high school.”
