- 80 credits includes required courses and elective courses (a minimum of 4 courses ( 16 credits) at the Grade 12 level including English 12)
- Three Provincial Graduation Assessments:
- Grade 10 Numeracy Assessment (GNA 10)
- Grade 10 Literacy Assessment (GLA 10)
- Grade 12 Literary Assessment (GLA 12)
- New Indigenous Education Requirement - all students will be required to complete this new requirement beginning next year.

## WHAT IS AN INCOMPLETE SCORE? <br> - (35\% TO 49\%)

## WHAT HAPPENS AFTER?

- Attend Summer School (Academic Completion) to complete the course - register in June
- 4 weeks in July
- $11 / 2$ hours per day per course
- Can take 1 or 2 courses
- The incomplete grade is changed in August to a PASS or FAIL

## WHAT IS A FAILING SCORE? <br> - $00 \%$ TO 34\% )

Example: If you fail Math 9, take Math 9 in first semester of grade 10 and then take Math 10 in second semester.

All compulsory courses must be repeated if failed (English, Socials, Math, Science, PE)
